TOP architect **Winka Dubbeldam's** (left) Brooklyn Heights loft is back on the market for \$2.1 million — down from its original asking price of \$2.69 million in 2018. Dubbeldam bought the two-bedroom, two-bathroom condo, on the ninth floor of condo building One Brooklyn Bridge Park, for \$1.71 million in 2013, according to property records. The 1,562-square-foot apartment is in a 12-story former warehouse that dates to 1928 and is located at 360 Furman St. The unit features wide-plank hardwood floors, 13-foot ceilings, floor-to-ceiling glass windows overlooking the Statue of Liberty and a chef's kitchen with two dishwashers, two ovens and a long, yellow counter. Netherlands-born Dubbeldam, of course, redid the apartment herself. The yellow kitchen counter? All her. She added a fireplace, which was a wish-list item. One bedroom has iridescent gray wallpaper, while the other is patterned with animal skeletons. Dubbeldam has offices of her firm, Archi-Tectonics, in New York, Amsterdam and Hangzhou, China. She is also chair of architecture at the University of Pennsylvania's Stuart Weitzman School of Design. She has said her apartment is her experimental "sanctuary."
